German-Polish-Belarusian seminar for students and young people in Weimar (Germany) on dealing with Nazi crimes using the example of Soviet Special Camp No. 2 in Buchenwald

The seminar from the 'History and Human Rights' series will take place on the grounds of the Buchenwald Memorial. Here the Soviet Special Camp No. 2 for German internees was located in the Soviet occupation zone from 1945 to 1950. We will discuss what happened in Germany after the end of the war and how the crimes of the National Socialists have been dealt with over time. We want to look at the topic from different perspectives: Polish, Belarusian and German. We will also get to know the memorial, its exhibitions about the Buchenwald concentration camp, forms of remembrance of the camp in the GDR and today. We will examine the current exhibition on the Soviet special camp and discuss concepts for a future presentation of the topic. Part of the seminar is dedicated to the history of Weimar during the National Socialist era and will include a visit to the new museum on forced Jahour under National Socialism.
